SS = Social Sciences Requirement (2 courses, one of which must be focused outside the US\*\*) A&H = Arts & Humanities Requirement (2 courses, one must be focused outside the US\*\*) DIV = Social Diversity Requirement (2 courses; one US Diversity and one African American Exp.) WAC/SPAC = Writing/Speaking Across the Curriculum Requirement (3 courses, one in the major) CAP = Capstone Requirement \*\* of the SS and A&H courses focused outside the US, one must be focused on Africa, Latin America, Asia or the Middle East (ALAAME)
