**Degree Requirements: 120 Credit Hours & required coursework**

**Fall 2022 – Spring 2023: Bachelor of Science Degree – Healthcare Management Major Requirements**

**Assumptions:** college-level readiness in MTH & ENG; no Foreign Language Deficiency. **College/Program Notes:** Bachelor of Science/Business students are required to complete 120 hours of course work that includes university, college, and major requirements. Adhering to the recommended sequence outlined in this document provides a balanced workload and ensures that students will have the proper prerequisites and knowledge for maximum benefit of the courses required for this program.

**BS Degree & Healthcare Management Major Academic Grade Requirements:** A minimum of a final grade of C or higher is required for the following courses: ENG 100/101, ENG

102, BUS 201 or STA 147, OSM 202, GAD 250 and all WAC courses. **Math Requirements:** HCM BS Degree required math courses: BUS 201 or STA 147 and OSM 202 courses to satisfy M/QL and major requirements.

**Healthcare Management Major Requirements:** All Healthcare Management major courses require a final grade of "C" or higher or the course must be repeated.

Students must have a minimum of 120 total credit hours, which includes CSU Gen Ed (35-36 hrs) – specific M/QL math courses and SS – PSY 101, HCM Major credit hours (85hrs) of Business core (34 hrs), Healthcare Management core (24 hrs) and HCM Management Concentration (27 hrs), of which a minimum of 42 credit hours must be upper division (300 or 400-level courses).

**Graduation requirements:** Completion of required M/QL courses and all HCM major courses: Business core, HCM core and HCM Concentration with a final grade of C or higher for all WAC courses: GAD 250 and 2 WAC courses selected from HCM Concentration – CSU Approved WAC courses: Concentration Electives can be used for minor/certificate or second major coursework.

**Academic – Graduation Requirements: Bachelor of Arts Degree: Africana Studies Major**

*Assumptions: college-level readiness in MTH & ENG; no Foreign Language Deficiency*

**College/ Program Notes:**

The plan above is a suggested guide to ensure that all General Education, College, University, and Major Requirements are met within 4 years of study. Students may deviate from the suggested placement of Gen Ed courses, although the M/QL and W/C requirements should be completed during the first year of study.

**University Notes:**

\*General Electives ensure that a student accumulates the minimum credit hour totals needed for graduation. Students must have a minimum of 120 total credit hours, of which a minimum of 42 credit hours must be upper division (300 or 400-level courses). Depending upon other elective choices made, students may not need as many general electives as indicated above, or may need additional electives.

^ AST Foundational Courses (Section A). Student must complete the following FOUR courses: AST 200: Intro to Africana Studies (offered fall and spring), AST 300: Blk Psychology (offered fall), AST 350: African Am Family Life (WAC and offered spring), and AST 402: Capstone (offered spring)

^^ AST Sections B, C and E. Students must select one course from EACH section. SECTION B-students select one course from: HIS 175: Intro to Africa (offered fall) or ANT 153: Intro to African Cultures (offered fall). While HIS 175 or ANT 153 fulfills one of the requirements for the major, both can satisfy the A&H (ALAAME) or SS (ALAAME) elective respectively. If students use HIS 175 or ANT 153 to satisfy the A&H or SS (ALAAME) Elective, then students have the option to choose a AST 300/400 level elective during the fourth year. SECTION C-students select one course from: AST 394: Ghana, Slave Trade, and African Diaspora; HIS 364: Caribbean History to 1804 (fall semester); HIS 366: Colonial Latin Am (spring semester); HIS 367: Modern Latin America (offered spring); or HIS 369: Comparative Emancipation (fall semester). SECTION E-students pursuing dual degree with Healthcare Management must take ENG 347: Studies in African American Literature to complete the minimum of 21 credit hours at the 300-400 level for the Africana Studies major.

^^^AST African American History, Culture, and Politics (Section D). Student must select TWO courses: one from list 1 and the other from list 2. LIST 1: HIS 215: Af Am Hist to 1877 (offered fall and spring), HIS 216: AF Am Hist to since 1877 (offered fall and spring), or UST 202: Cleve: The Af Am Exp (offered fall and spring). AST LIST 2: Students pursuing dual degree with Healthcare Management must take PSC 305: Cultural Diversity in US Politics (offered fall and spring) to satisfy both the U.S. Diversity general education requirement and major requirement.

***Due to the sequence of courses in the Africana Studies major curriculum, it is strongly advised students work closely with the director and general education advisor to ensure efficiency while moving through the requirements.***

**Academic – Graduation Requirements: Bachelor of Science Degree: Healthcare Management Major**

**College/ Program Notes:**

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\* **Math Courses:** Based on HCM Major Concentration: HCM non-BBA Concentration – Double Major – Africana Studies: Select math courses: STA 147 and OSM 202 courses to satisfy M/QL and major requirements

Graduation requirements: Completion of required M/QL courses and all HCM major courses: Business core, HCM core and HCM Concentration with a final grade of C or higher (W) GAD 250 and 2 WAC or SPAC courses selected from HCM Concentration – CSU Approved WAC courses
