College/ Program Notes:

The plan above is a suggested guide to ensure that all General Education, College, University, and Major requirements are met within 4 years of study. Students may deviate from the suggested placement of Gen Ed courses, although the M/QL and W/C requirements should be completed during the first year of study.

*Electives ensure that a student accumulates the minimum credit hour totals needed for graduation. Students must have a minimum of 120 total credit hours, of which a minimum of 36 credit hours must be upper division (300 or 400-level courses). Depending upon elective choices made, students may not need as many general electives as indicated above, or may need additional electives. This degree map assumes that all PSY or ART (Design) electives are 300/400-level courses.

^PSY 217 & 317 are both QL courses. Only one QL course can be applied to the M/QL requirement; the other course must be a MTH/STA course.
